

The Governor this day granted a pardon to Amos Shipley, for Negroes, convicted Sept. Term 1855 of the Circuit Court for Howard County of Larceny and sentenced to ten months confinement in the Penitentiary.

Oct. 19th

The Governor this day, under Act of Assembly of 1853 ch. 304 for the incorporation of a Company to build a Turnpike Road from Woodboro to Monocacy bridge, on the road leading to Frederick City, issued his license to the President and Managers of said Co. under the great Seal of the State, permitting them to erect upon and across said road such and so many gates as will be necessary and sufficient to collect the tolls and duties granted to said Company by the Act of Assembly aforesaid.

22nd

The Governor this day pardoned this day John Simon, who was convicted at the February Term 1855 of persuading slaves to run away, upon condition that within six months from the date of said pardon he leave the State of Maryland and never again return thereto.

Same day the Governor also granted a Writ Prosequi to the said John Simon who also stands charged upon indictment in the Circuit Court aforesaid with enticing slaves to run away.

Oct. 30th

The Governor this day directed publication of the usual Notice of applications having been made for the pardon of Daniel Briceford, convicted May Term 1857 of the late Baltimore City Court of Voluntary and sentenced to be confined in the Penitentiary for six years, which sent to Baltimore on the 5th of Baltimore.
