

Feb. 26th

The Gov. sent to the Senate certain civil and Military nominations. See Executive Nominations.

27th

The Governor this day directed publication of the writ of Habeas Corpus having been made to him for the Prisoner of William Davis committed September Term 1857 of the Criminal Court late Baltimore City Court, of an Assault with intent to commit a rape on one Mary Ann Loggins, and whose term of confinement in the Penitentiary will expire in the Month of April next. Case to be considered on or after Monday March 24th 1856.

Same day the Governor pardoned Martin Coughlin convicted of Houselighting at November Term 1854 of the Circuit Court for Baltimore County. For further law see Record of Pardons.

28th

The Governor committed a fine of \$25 imposed upon Peter Dugby at April Term 1855 of the Circuit Court for Allegany County for an Assault & Battery.
