

March 4th 1856.

The Governor this day refused a Pardon to Isaac D. Rose who was convicted at the October Term 1855 of the Circuit Court for Frederick County of Burglary.

Same day Gov. sent to the Senate sundry Military nominations.

5th

The Gov. this day pardoned Joseph Pelly who was convicted at the November Term 1855 of the Circuit Court for Washington County of "felony in stealing a hog."

6th

The Governor issued his Requisition upon the Governor of Virginia for the apprehension and delivery of a certain H. L. Bernard, alias Blumhardt, charged upon the affidavit of one Augustus C. L. Keese with the Larceny of one gold Watch and Chain of the value of \$150 and one pocket book containing \$36 the property of one Moses H. Sherman, and being a fugitive from the justice of this State and represented to have taken refuge in the State of Virginia. A. C. L. Keese named in said Requisition as the Agent of this State to receive the said fugitive.

Same day the Governor nominated to the Senate William H. Hoff to be Justice of the Peace for and for District to-wit, Sampson Silby resigned.

7th

The Gov. this day, in compliance with the request of the Legislature transmitted to the Senate and Representatives of this State in the Congress of the United States, Resolutions introduced by the General Assembly of Maryland relative to the claims of this State now pending in the said Congress.
