

January 28th 1862

The Governor issued commissions to all the officers of the 5th Regiment of Maryland Volunteers (otherwise known as the Public Guard) see Record of Military Commissions

31st

The Governor issued commissions to Samuel M. Rankin and Benjamin C. Guyton as Justices of the Peace for the 11th District of Baltimore County in place of Benjamin Wilson and Baloes Allender who failed to qualify within the prescribed time.

Same day the Governor examined and approved the Bonds of John Shultz a Notary Public for Carroll County and directed same to be filed in this Department.

February 3rd

The Governor directed the usual notice to be given of an application for a Nolle prosequi in the case of Frank C. Carlin indicted in the Circuit Court for Frederick's County at the February term 1862 for keeping a Billiard table without a license.

Same day the Governor examined and approved the Bonds of Robert Fowler State Treasurer. (Files with Clerk of the Court of Appeals)

7th

The Governor transmitted to the House of Delegates the following communication

Annapolis, February 7th 1862

To the House of Delegates:

Gentlemen:— I propose to deliver to-day, to Colonel Dixon S. Miles, of the United States Army, the Sword which, by resolution of the General Assembly at January session, 1860, the Governor was directed to procure and present to him.

If it meets the concurrence of your Honorable Body I will make the presentation in the Hall of the House of Delegates, and at such hour as you may be pleased to designate
