April 22<sup>nd</sup>

The Governor issued his warrant for the admission of Thomas J. Sprague a Deaf Mute into the Columbia Institution Washington D. C. under the provisions of art 33 sections 1 & 2 of the Code of Public General Laws.

Same day the Governor issued Commissions to sundry Commissioners and Trustees of The Maryland State Hospital for Insane persons. See Record of Executive appointments - general list

April 23<sup>rd</sup>

The Governor granted a pardon to V. A. Gotliver convicted at March term 1862 of the Circuit Court for Howard County of Larceny and sentenced to the Penitentiary for sixteen months.

Same day the Governor issued a commission to Eliza Wynn as Justice of the Peace & ward of Baltimore City. see Docket of Executive appointments Page 58.

Same day the Governor vested J. L. W. Phail with additional authority to collect State arms see letter Book page 275.

April 25<sup>th</sup>

The Governor approved the official Bond of William F. Murdoch Notary Public Baltimore and directed his Commission to issue. Issued accordingly see Docket page 7.

April 26<sup>th</sup>

The Governor directed the usual notice to be published of an application for Pardon in the case of Emeline Haines convicted at the April term 1862 of the Circuit Court for Carroll County of Bastardy and begetting a child by a Negro Slave. Notice sent to "American Sentinel" Westminster Carroll County.

April 28<sup>th</sup>

The Governor directed the usual notice to be published of an application for pardon in the case of Robert Brown convicted at the October term 1858 of the Circuit Court for Kent County of an assault and battery with intent to kill. Notice sent to the Kent News. see Docket of Pardons

Same day the Governor approved the official Bond William H. Wilson Notary Public at Williamsport and directed his commission to issue. Issued accordingly.

Same day the Governor issued a Commission to Charles C. Bushnell as Commissioner of Deeds for New York.
