May 30th

The Governor issued Commissions to sundry officers of the 2nd Regiment Potomac Home Brigade - see Military record.

May 31st

The Governor issued Commissions to sundry officers of the 2nd Regt. E. S. Maryland Volunteers - see Military record.

June 3rd

The Governor directed publication of the usual notice of an application for Pardon in the case of William Blufford convicted for Rape at the April term 1848 of Baltimore County Court and sentenced to imprisonment in the Penitentiary for twentyone years.

Same day the Governor commissioned sundry Cavalry officers attached to the Potomac Home Brigade.

June 4th

The Governor approved the official Bond of Thomas C. Crouch Notary Public at Elkton Cecil County and directed his commission to issue.

June 9th

The Governor issued the following civil commissions vizt to Morris S. Wickersham of Philadelphia as Commissioner of Deeds for Pennsylvania; to Thomas C. Crouch of Elkton Cecil County as Notary Public; to James Brenton as Justice of the Peace for 7th Election District of Somerset County.

June 11th

The Governor granted a Volle Prosequi to Washington Ratchiff indicted for Larceny at September term 1861 of the Criminal Court of Baltimore City whose case was afterward removed to the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County. Found guilty but the sentence of the Court suspended. See Pardon record page 343. The condition of the Pardon being that he leave the State of Maryland within sixty days after his discharge from custody.
