The Governor issued his warrant directed to the Sheriff of Calvert County for the execution of Bill Ferguson - a slave. on Friday the fifth day of September 1862. Convicted at May term 1862 of the Circuit Court for Calvert County of Murder in the first degree and sentenced to be hung. See Pardons record page 346.
