

1863

May 26th

The Governor appointed John White of Somerset County Notary Public to reside at Salisbury, and directed notices to be sent to file the Bonds as required by the act of 1862 Chap. 113.

May 28th

The Governor issued a warrant to the Sheriff of Frederick County for the arrest and delivery to the authorities of Pennsylvania of Lycourus F. Gurley charged on indictment with the crime of seduction committed in said State and demanded on requisition by his Excellency the Governor thereof.

May 29th

The Governor issued his warrant for the admission of Eva Ann Lavinia Myeriger of Frederick County into the Maryland Institution for the Blind as a State beneficiary for the term of eight years to commence from the 1st day of September next.

May 30th

The Governor appointed and Commissioned Edward J. Mainwright of Somerset County Justice of the Peace of the 5th Election District of said County vice Seth D. Variable resigned.

Same day the Governor remitted the forfeited Recognizance of Ann Koshway, as security for the appearance of William Koshway at the October term 1862 of the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County.

June 1st

The Governor under the authority of the act of 1862 chapter 106 converted the punishment imposed upon negroes Alexander Harris and Sam Anderson by the Circuit Court for Kent County at April term 1861 for setting fire to a Printing office and ordered by said Court to be sold out of the State, to confinement in the Penitentiary.

The said negroes having continued in confinement in the jail of said County from the time of their conviction to the present, the condition of the country rendering a sale of them impracticable, the Governor orders each of them to be confined in the Penitentiary for three years from this date.

Under the same authority and for like reason negro Henry Garrett who was convicted at the same term of said Court of assault with intent to kill &c.
