and ordered to be sold out of the State is ordered by the Governor to be confined in the Penitentiary for two years from this date.

June 2nd

The Governor granted a pardon to Wallace Wilhelm convicted in the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County at October term 1860 of an assault with intent to murder and sentenced to undergo a confinement in the Maryland Penitentiary for the term of two years and four months.

June 3rd

The Governor issued four requisitions upon the Governor of Pennsylvania for the arrest and delivery of four negro boys Charles Williams, George Croggins, William Williams and Charles Scite slaves of Mrs Mary J. Worthington of Baltimore County who severally stand charged on indictment with the crime of Larceny committed in said County and appointed Joseph Allison of said County agent on the part of the State to receive said fugitives.

June 4th

The Governor issued a warrant to the Sheriff of Allegany County for the arrest and delivery to the authorities of Pennsylvania of Henry Francis Perrin charged on indictment with the crimes of Seduction, Fornication and Bastardy committed in said State.

June 8th

The Governor directed the usual notice to be published of an application for pardon in the case of Peter Rehill convicted at April term 1858 of the Circuit Court for Dorchester County of Rape and sentenced to two years imprisonment in the Penitentiary. Notice sent to the Cambridge Herald and Tuesday June 30th 1863 appointed as the day of hearing.

June 13th

The Governor directed the usual notice to be published of an application for pardon in the case of Emory Ruggold (free negro) convicted at April term 1861 of the Circuit Court for Kent County of petty larceny and sentenced to be sold out of the State for eighteen months. Notice sent to the Kent news and Thursday July 3rd 1863 appointed as the day of hearing.
