

with the terms of the Law, viz upon a certificate from your Agent or the Brigade Inspector that the Company has at least 48 Men in uniform, and upon the filing of a sufficient Bond for the return of the arms when called for.

I enclose you a blank Bond. The Penalty should be double the value of the Army-Muskets and accoutrements as estimated at \$15 each.

Sir,

(By an act of the General Assembly passed December 2d 1832, of which, at your request, an unauthenticated copy was transmitted to you on the 27th day of March 1833) the consent of this State was given to exchange the location, of a part of the line between the National Road within our limits, upon certain conditions, among which, that a good and substantial stone Bridge shall be made over the Mill Race in the Town of Cumberland, and over Miles Creek, at the place proposed, and that substantial stone Bridges or Culverts shall be made whenever the same may respectively be necessary along the line of said Road." By the same Act John Goye & Nesbuck Frost Equine and the Super-intendant for the time being of the said Road, appointed by the President of the United States, were appointed Commissioners to report the said National Road when finished and repaired within the limits of this State, to the Governor and Council."

A communication has been received from John Goye Equine, in which he states, that the War Department has now directed and contracted to have all the Bridges on the said new location built of wood. I beg leave to call your attention to this subject in the fullest confidence that there has been some mistake or misapprehension on the part of some of the agents or persons employed upon the work in question, and that you will cause the terms and conditions upon which the consent of the State was given to the proposed improvement to be respected and carried into effect?
