Dear Sir,

Herewith enclosed you will receive two accounts for money ^{due the State from} Alexander Milburn collector of State Taxes in St Marys County for the years 1845 and 1846.

The account for 1845 is for a balance principal and interest of \$2,655.23^{cts} with interest from 7th October 1847. That of 1846 is for the sum of \$10,292.88^{cts} with interest from 1st October 1847. Being the entire amount of taxes placed in his hands for collection for that year and upon which no payment has been made. For both these claims you will be good enough to institute suits immediately upon Milburns official bonds against himself and his securities. As copies of these bonds have never been returned to the Treasury, you will oblige me by stating in your letter acknowledging this, who the securities are and what means they propose to meet these liabilities.
