Sir:—In obedience to law, we have the honor to transmit the annual abstract of the proceedings of the Mary-land Penitentiary.

We have the pleasure, again to off r the congratulations of the board on the continued and increase of prosperity of this establishment. It appears now to have reached a point of production and profit, unparallelled perhaps in the history of institutions of its kind. For this we are mainly indebted to the Executive Committee; who having abundant means at command, carefully watch the market, and are enabled to obtain all articles of provision and materials at the lowest rate of prices, and equally to the industry, perspicacity and resolution of the principal keeper, and the fidelity of his deputies having
