Copy of a Report from B igadier General Solomon Dickirson, of Arms of the 12th Brigade of Maryland

TALBOT COUNTY, December 1st, 1829.

His Excellency Governor Martin,

Si—Agreeably to your orders, covering a resolution of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at its last session, 'Requiring the Brigadier Generals throughout the state, to ascertain the condition of the public arms within their respective commands, &c.' I forthwith issued orders, calling on the following Officers of the Twelch Brigade, Maryland Vilitia, who appear from the statement received from the Clerk of the Council, to have received public arms, &c. from the State, and received the answers annexed to their names.

John Donavan, 2 six pound field pieces, complete, 20 artiliery swords. Bond on file for the field pieces, but not for the swords.—Reports the possession of them, but does not state their condition.

Theodore R. Loockerman, 50 rifles, 50 cartouch boxes.

B. nd on file. Reports that 38 rifles a 1

38 cartouch boxes are returned to the
Armorer, the remainder in the hands of
the Company, in good order.

Thomas Burchenal, 60 cartouch boxes. Bond on file.

Richard Spencer. 36 muskets, 50 rifles, 50 powder horns, 50 pouches. Bond on file. Reports the rifles in good order, in possession of the Company. The muskets, powder horns and pouches, were never received.

Kimenel Goodwin, 68 rifles, 25 cartouch boxes, 25 pouches. Bond on file. No return.
