REPORT.

That in the spirit of the resolution, authorizing an annual committee of the Legislature, in reference to the proceedings and present condition of this time honoured institution, they have visited the College, and enjoyed a frank and liberal interview, with its distinguished Principal, and the able Faculty associated with him. The result has been, a conviction that the College, as now constituted, under a high minded and faithful board of Visitors and Governors, to supervise the conduct and interests of the general establishment, comprehending the faculty and pupils, and the able and well appointed Professors in the several departments, should attract the favour and arouse the pride of Marylanders in its support. The number of
