REPORT:

That they have attentively read the said memorial, and believing its only object to be, to cast a censure on the majority of the committee, the committee have deemed it due to themselves, and to the House of which they are members, to give a narrative of certain facts, believed to be material to a true understanding of the position now occupied by Mr. Welch. On the 2d of February, the house determined that Charles G. Puckett, mentioned in Mr. Welsh's memorial, was not a legal and qualified voter; and also passed the following order:—
