To the Honorable,

The House of Delegates:

In obedience to their order of the 16th inst. the Treasurer reports the accompanying table—shewing, the amounts of assessable property in—the amounts for direct taxes of 1841 and 1842 paid by—and the gross amounts for the same taxes now due from—each of the counties, Howard district and the city of Baltimore.

He has not included the direct tax for 1843, because it is not only not now due, but has not yet been even levied in any portion of the State—and until it shall have been levied, and the proper returns of the levy made to the Treasury, he has no source of information therein, whence he may properly, even estimate its

amount.

He also reports in obedience to the same order, tables from the census of 1840—shewing the produce of agriculture and of mines—the capital employed in commerce—and the value of the manufactures, (so far as he had progressed with this last exhibit, when the order of the 28th inst. relieved him from its further preparation,) in each of the counties, and the said district and city.
