

A BILL.

Entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to prohibit the sale of Intoxicating Liquors on the Sabbath day.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, that at the first general election to be held from and after the passage of this act it shall and may be lawful for the voters in the several counties, Howard district and in the city of Baltimore, to vote for, or against, the act known as the "Sunday Law" and to which this is a supplement, upon separate ballots, on which the words "for the Sunday Law," or "against the Sunday Law," shall be plainly designated; and it shall be the duty of the several judges of election for the said counties, Howard district and the city of Baltimore aforesaid, to receive and count the said ballots, so cast as aforesaid.

Sec. 2. And it is further enacted, That if, when the said vote is so reckoned in the said counties, Howard district, and the city of Baltimore, as aforesaid, it shall appear that there is in the said counties, or any one thereof, or in Howard district or the city of Baltimore, a majority of all the votes cast against the Sunday Law, the judges of election in said counties, or county, district, or city shall make return thereof to the sheriffs of the counties or county, district, or city, as the case may be; and it shall be the duty of the sheriff to make the same known forthwith, by publication.

Sec. 3. And it is further enacted, That if in the said counties or any one of them, or in Howard district or in the city of Baltimore, there shall appear by the publication of the sheriff, as heretofore provided, that there was a majority of votes cast against the said law, then, and in that event persons selling liquor on the Sabbath day, in the said counties or county, district, or city, shall not be subject to the pains and penalties provided for in the act to which this is a supplement.

Sec. 4. It is further enacted, That all the laws which have been heretofore passed, as to the qualification of voters, and to restrain and punish illegal voting, shall govern and apply to the vote which shall be taken under and by virtue of the provisions of his act.
