350. A further supplement to the act to incorporate the Marine Insurance company.

351. An act to incorporate the Operative Society of Shoemakers on the Ladies Branch.

352. An act to change the name of Mary Ann Fisher, of Baltimore city.

353. A further supplement to an act relating to attachments issued by justices of the peace, so far as the same relates to Kent county.

354. An act to continue in force such acts of assembly, as would expire during the present session.

355. An act to provide for the measurement of lime in Montgomery county.

356. An act to incorporate the Mutual Insurance company of Weverton.

357. An act to regulate the inspection of Lumber and Shingles at Heckart Town, in Cecil county; and to limit the jurisdiction of the inspector.

358. An act to incorporate the Union Plank or Turnpike Road company.

359. An act to incorporate the Caroline Division, No. 53, of the Sons of Temperance.

360. An act to make valid a deed of conveyance from Jaspar Yewell and wife, and Thomas W. Yewell and wife, to William Wood.

361. An act to make valid a certain deed executed by Robert Welch, of Ben., as attorney of Nicholas Darnall.

362. An act to revive and continue an act entitled, an act to incorporate the village of Greensborough.

363. An act to allow John Thawley, collector of Caroline county, further time to complete his collections.

365. An act authorising commissioners to lay off and locate a public road from Marriottsville, in Howard district, to the old Frederick road.
