find that the memorialists are mistaken—honestly, no doubt. Our forefathers dealt justly with the Indians—Maryland never failed in any of her obligations; but, always friendly, shielded under her protecting wing, the red men of the forest; and, finally, when they determined to leave our borders, and remove with the bones of their ancestors to a distant home, paid all that was required, and thus our forefathers and theirs parted friends. The committee ask that the memorialists have leave to withdraw their petition.
