

Six hundred & twenty one. Int it used an act for the raising
 and providing a support for his Lordships the Lord and
 Proprietary of this Province during his natural life &
 likewise a supply towards the defraying the publick
 Charges of Government. It was enacted that the said act
 and all and every the articles, provisions, matters and
 things therein contained should stand and be by that
 present act ratified & confirmed to all intents and
 purposes according to the true Intent and meaning
 thereof not only for and during the Life of the Right
 Hon^{ble} Cecilus absolute Lord and Proprietary of this
 Province and for one Yeare after as aforesaid but also
 for and during the natural life of the Right Hon^{ble} Charles
 Calvert Esq^r Sonne and heir apparent of the said Cecilus
 Lord Proprietary and no longer And that from & after
 the decease of the said Cecilus Lord Proprietary the duty
 and imposition of two shillings per hoghead in the said
 act mentioned should be Levyed raised collected and
 paid to the said Charles Calvert Esq^r for and during
 the terme of his natural life as aforesaid in such man-
 ner and under such paines penalties & forfeitures as
 by the said recited act was limited & appointed to
 be paid to the said Cecilus Lord Proprietary as aforesaid
 provided allwayes never thelesse that all and every
 the severall provisions in the said Act contained should
 during the continuance of the said recited act stand
 in full force and vertue and be inseparably annexed
 to the said last recited act provided alsoe that from
 and after the end of that present Session of Gen^ll
 Assembly in case of Shipwreck or taking of any
 Ship or vessell shippes or vesselles so that the Tobaccos
 therein laded should be lost before the delivery of the
 Ship or vessel at his or their port then the Master or
 Merchant or other owner of such Tobaccos so laded &
 lost as aforesaid should be repayed the said duty or
 Imposition of two shillings per hoghead or have
 liberty to ship at some other time so many hogheads
 of Tobacco as they had formerly paid money for as
 aforesaid free and cleere of any the said Impositions
 as by the said severall acts relation being thereunto
 had
