An Act For Keeping Holy the Lords Day

Forasmuch as there is nothing more acceptable to almight  
ty God then the true and sincere service & worship of him  
according to his holy will and forasmuch as the sancti  
fying or keeping holy of the Lords Day commonly called  
Sunday is and hath been esteemed by the present and all  
primitive Christian Churches and People a principall &  
chief part of the said worship which day in most places  
of this Province hath been and still is profaned and  
Neglected by a wicked and disorderly sort of people by  
working Dunkenesse swearing gaming unlawfull  
pastimes and other debaucheries to the high dishonour  
of Almighty God the Scandall of Christian Religion and  
the appparent detriment and Ruine of many of the Inhabi  
tants of this Province for remedy whereof for the future Be  
it enacted by the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Proprietary by and  
with the Consent of the upper and lower houses of this  
present Generall Assembly and the authority of the same  
that from and after twenty days next after the end of  
this Session of Assembly noe person or persons within  
this Province shall work or doe any bodily labour or  
occupation upon any Lords day commonly called Sunday  
nor shall command or willfully suffer or permit any  
of his or their children hired servants servants or  
slaves to work or labour as aforesaid (the absolute &  
works of necessity and mercy alwayes excepted) And  
for that through the wicked and profane licentious  
ness of severall persons inhabiting or travelling into  
this Province it hath been customary for such sort  
of persons to spend the said day in the bodily exercise  
or occupation of fishing Be it likewise enacted by the  
authority
