An act for erecting of Providence into a County
by the name of Ann-Arundell County

Be it enacted by the Lord Prop^{ty}, by & with the assent and
approbation of both upper & lower houses of this Assembly, that
that part of the Province of Maryland on the west side of the Bay
of Chesapeake, over agt^t of Isle of Kent formerly called by the name
of Providence ~~be a separate County~~ by the Inhabitants there
residing & inhabiting this year, shall from henceforth be erected into
a Shire or County by the name of Ann-Arundell County, & by that
name hereafter to be ever called. ~

An act prohibiting foreign Ingrossers.

Whereas divers Masters & Merchants of ships and other Vessels
trading into this Province do purchase great quantities of tobacco
and afterwards employ the same tobacco in buying commodities imported
and either sell the said Commodities to the Inhabitants of this Province
at excessive rates, or export the same, to the great loss, damage and
detriment of the Inhabitants of this Province.

Be it therefore Enacted by the Right hon^{ble} the Lord Prop^{ty}
by & with the advice & assent of the upper & lower houses of this
present gen^{al} Assembly, That no person or persons so trading as
aforesaid into this Province shall buy & sell again or transport any
such goods imported (provision & other necessaries only excepted) upon
the penalty of forfeiting all such goods, or the value thereof, the one
halfe to the Lord Prop^{ty}, the other halfe to the Informer to be recovered
in any Court of record within this Province by Bill, plaint or
information, wherein no affigne, protection or wager of Law to be
allowed. This act to endure for three years, or to the end of the next
gen^{al} Assembly.
