An Act to prevent the Exporting of Trash, or bad Tobacco.

HEREAS, by an Act of Assembly entituled, An Act for a- Preemble mending the Staple of Tohacco, for preventing Frauls in his Niajesty's Customs, and for the Limitation of Officers Fees, it was among other Things enacted and declared, " That it was " the true Intent and Meaning of the flid Act, that nothing therein con-" tained should affect any Tobacco that was made at any Time before the " first Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and forty-seven; " but that the same might be shipped, or otherwise disposed of, as the " Proprietor thereof should think proper; Oath, or Affirmation if a Qua-" ker, being made by the Proprietor of such old Tobacco, or Overseer, or " other credible Person, that the same was made before the said first Day " of December, One thousand seven hungred and forty-seven; which "Oath of Affirmation might be made before any one Justice of the Peace, " and fuch Justice giving Certificate of the Mark and Number of the Hog-" shead or Hogsheads of such reld Tobacco, the same might be taken on " board any Ship or Vest 1 for Transportation, notwithstanding any Thing " in the laid A& contained: Yt, the Proprietor of such old Tobicco " might, if he thought sit, have the same old Tobacco inspected, or sub-" jedted to Inspection, as the said Act directs, and in such Cale he should have and receive all Berefits and Advantages arising to the Owner of " Inspected Tobacco, in Manner therein before mentioned." And whereas it appears to this G neral Assembly, that sundry evil-minded Persons have, fince the making the faid Act, laved, bought, and, under colour of it's being old Tobacco, actually exported, and now do openly and publiely fave and buy up, bad, trath, and unfound Tobacco, with the same View; which Practices, to plainly tending to furtirate all the good and

must prove of very dangerous Consequence to the People of this Province. Be it therefore Enasted by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietaty, by and with the Advice and Content of his Lordship's Governor, and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That from and feer the twenty-fish Day of May, One thousand seven hundred and fifty, it shall not be lawful for any Person or Persons, under any Pretence whatsoever, to export or ship off, under the Denomination of old Tobacco, or Tobacco made before the first Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and forty-seven, unless the Proprietor thereof shall bring or cause to be brought the said Tobacco, in Hogshead or Hogsheads, to some Inspection-House; and when the same is so brought, deliver the same to the said Inspectors, and then and there the Proprietor, or some other credible Person, take the following Outh (or Affirmation if a Quaker); I A. B. do swear (or if a Quaker affirm), that all the Tobacco now within this Hogsbead (expressing the Mark and Number of each Hogshead) was really and bona fide made before the first Day of December, One thoufand seven bundred and forty-seven: Which Oath or Affirmation the said Inspectors shall, and they are hereby authorized, impowered, and required, to administer to the Person or Persons bringing the said Tobacca, such Perfon writing, or causing the same to be wrote; and the said Inspectors are hereby required to return all and every the faid Oaths or Affirmations to the next November County Court, to be held for the County where the Said Inspection-House shall be.

Salutary Effects intended by the said Act, if not immediately remedied,

And be it further Enasted by the Authority, Advice, and Consent aforesaid. That the Inspectors of the several and respective Warehouses within this Province shall, and they are hereby required, to receive the
