C H A P. XV.

An ACT to establish a Road from Hunting-Creek, in Dorchester, to Dover, in Talbot County.

THEREAS Henry Troth of Talbot County, by his humble Petition Preamble. to this General Assembly, among other Things, hath set forth, That it would not only be to the Ease of the Inhabitants of the Counties of Dorchester and Talbot, that a Public Road should be established. from Hunting-Creek, in Dorchester County, to Dover, in Talbot County, and a Ferry kept across the River of Choptank, at Dover, but to the great convenience of the Public, by shortning the Distance to all Persons travelling up or down the Eastern Shore of this Province; which said Petition is recommended by a great Number of the principal Inhabitants of the Counties aforefaid, and appears to this General Assembly to be true in it's Material Facts; it is therefore prayed that it may be Enacted;

II. And he it Enacted, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, by A Road to be and with the Advice and Confent of his Lordship's Governor, and the Upper and made 12 Feet Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That on the Applica- Choptank to tion of the faid Henry Troth, or any other Person, to the Justices of Dor- Dover. chester County, after a good and sufficient Road and Causeway, twelve Feet wide at least at the Top, shall be made and perfected through the Marsh of Choptank River, in Dorchester County, opposite to the Main Road at Dover aforesaid, it shall and may be lawful for the said Justices, and they are hereby required, to cause a Road to be laid out and sufficiently cleared and made, from the Road that leads from Hunting-Creek aforesaid, to Kingstown, in Talbot County, to the End of the said Causeway, where it shall join the fast Land, and from thence with the said Causeway, to the River aforesaid, and after the same shall be well and sufficiently cleared and made, the said Justices shall appoint an Overseer, with a sufficient Number of the Neighbouring Inhabitants under his Directions, to keep the said Road and Causeway in good Repair, as other Roads ought to be kept, without any further Tax upon the County; under the like Penalties for Neglect or Omission, as other Overseers and People under them, are by the Laws in Force relating to Public Roads, liable to.

III. Provided always, and be it Enacted, That the said Road shall be To be made laid out in such Manner and Form, as shall be most to the Public convenience, for the Puband least to the prejudice of the Possessor or Possessor of the Lands, on lic. which the same shall be made.

IV. And be it further Enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the 2,500 th of Tobacco to Justices aforesaid, and they are hereby required at their next November Court, be levied to after such Application, to assess and levy on the Taxable Inhabitants of the pay the Exfaid County of Dorchester, a sufficient Sum to defray the Expences of clearing pence. and making the Road aforesaid; to be paid and collected in the same Manner that the County Levies are paid and collected; Provided such Sum does not exceed the Quantity of Two Thousand Five Hundred Pounds of Tobacco.

H A P.
