IV. Be it enaited. That some one of the justices of the county shall, when thereto required by any inspector, lattend at the inspection house where such inspector shall be appointed, on some day in February next, and there see that the weights are all made good and just weights, agreeable to the standard of the county, who shall give a certificate there of to the inspector, to keep by him for his justification; all which expences thereon shall be paid as by the said act is directed.

v. And he it enacted. That no impector or inspectors heretofore appointed, or who shall hereaster be appointed in wirtue of this act, shall be liable to pay damages to the person holding any crop or transfer note, where the tobacco shall be taken from the warehouse or otherwise destroyed by the enemies of this state.

fubject or inhabitant of this state shall, within or without this state, and if any person whatsoever shall, within this state, forge or counterfeit any loan-office certificate of the state of Maryland, or shall alter the sum expressed in any of the said certificates, or shall pass in payment any such counterfeit or altered certificate, knowing the same to be counterfeit or altered, and shall be thereof convicted in the general court of this state, or shall stand mute, or peremptorily challenge above the number of twenty of the pannel, such person shall suffer death as a felon without benefit of clergy.
