penalties, who shall not be publicly known to be of the profession in religion known by the name of the Church of England, any thing in this act contained to the contrary thereof in any wife notwithstanding.

C H A P. IX, X, XI.

XVIII. And be it enasted, That the select vestries so to be chosen, select vestries and rheir successors, shall, as trustees of the parish, be vested with an glebe-lands, estate in see in all the glebe-lands, as also in all churches and chapels, &c. and the lands thereunto belonging, late the property of the people profeshing the religion of the Church of England, and also as trustees aforefold thell have full property in all books, plate, and other ornaments, belonging to faid churches and chapels, or any of them.

XIX. And be it enacted, That the said vestrymen, or the major vestrymen part of them, shall have sull power and authority to employ a minister may employ a minister, &c. or reader of the Church of England, to officiate in their respective churches or chapels, for such time as may be agreed upon; and may take in subscriptions from all persons willing to contribute towards the impport of such minister or reader, and also for the support of a clerk to fuch minister, and giving a salary not exceeding thirty pounds to the register of such vestries.

XX. And be it enasted, That the possession and free use of all glebe- Glebe-lands lands hall belong to the minister of each parish, from the time of his to belong to the minister, having agreed with the select vestry as aforesaid, for and during the &c. time he mall continue to officiate therein as minister of the parish; and he shall be entitled to all the profits thereof during the time aforesaid, and thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

C H A P.

An ACT to continue the acts of assembly therein mentioned.

E it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That an act of Two acts conassembly, entitled, An act to prevent forestalling and engrossing, and for other purposes therein mentioned, made at a session of affembly, begun and held at the city of Annapolis, on Monday the twenty-sixth of October, seventeen hundred and seventy-eight, be and is hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force, until the end of the next session of assembly. That another act of assembly, entitled, An act to prohibit, for a limitted time, the exportation of wheat, flour, rye, Indian corn, rice, bread, beef, pork, bacon, live stock, pers, beans, oats, and other victual, made at a session of assembly, begun and held at the city of Annapolis, on Monday the twenty-fixth of October, seventeen hundred and seventy-eight, be and is hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force, until the end of the next fession of assembly.

C H A P. XI.

A supplement to the ACT to raise the supplies for the year seventeen hundred and seventy-nine.

HEREAS it has been heretofore enacted, that a rate of five Preamble. shillings in the pound on the annual value shall be fet on all real and personal property within this state, (except as in the
