fuch money as may have been collected from him or them, as treble tax, under the act for the better fecurity of the government, and the collector is hereby directed and enjoined to restore the above-mentioned sums of money, on application of such person or persons, his or their executors, administrators or assigns, on his or their producing a certificate of his or their having taken, repeated and subscribed the aforesaid oath or affirmation, within the time limited by this act for that purpose:

Sheriff to make the reimbursements out of the money by him received as collector, &c.

IV. And be it further enacted, That the sheriff shall make the above reimbursements out of the monies received by him as collector of the tax, and shall have allowance made to him in his account with the commissioners of the tax, for all monies so repaid in virtue of this act.

C H A P. XXII.

An ACT for the payment of the journal of accounts.

Preamble.

HEREAS it appears by the journal of accounts and list of debts, that there is now due from this state the sum of nineteen thousand two hundred and sixty pounds eight shillings and nine-pence common money:

Treasurer of W. shore to pay the jour-nal of accounts, &c.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore shall, and he is hereby authorised and required to deliver, out of the bills of credit which now are or shall be in his hands for the use of this state, to the several persons, their executors, administrators, assigns, or orders, or to such of them as shall offer to receive the same, the several sums of money allowed to them respectively, as they appear to be stated and ascertained by the journal of accounts and list of debts aforesaid.
