Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Authorised to That the president and directors of the Hager's-Town Bank are ty. hereby authorised and empowered, to sell at public auction, or otherwise, any real property which the said corporation now holds; and the president of said bank, for the time being, shall be fully empowered to convey the same by a good and sufficient deed of conveyance to the purchaser or purchasers of said real property.
