

An Act for the publication of Marriages, Voted that a new one be made
the former being short of the Indaimed at, the Act being intended against
Clandestine Marriages

Then was read an Act for the Advancement of Children's Estates
Voted that this Act be revived

Then was read the Act concerning Limitting Servants Times
Voted that into this Act be inserted these Words, (excepting such Servants
which by this Law are only to serve four Years) & that they be added next after
these Words in the said Act, to witt (shall serve one Year's time of Service of
the directions aforesaid & that the Act for the rest pass as it lyeth

Then was read an Act for the appointment of certain Officers
Voted that the Lower House be consulted with how the Lord Proprietary as well
as the people of this Province shall be secured of their dues from every Sheriff
by such Sheriff as shall be by them prevented according to this Act

An Act for military Discipline. Voted that it be renewed

An Act concerning the height of Sences Voted that it be renewed

An Act concerning the setting up of a Mint. Voted that the Lieutenant
Generall confirm that Act in the Lord Proprietary's Name & that the Lower
House be desired to join with this House in an Act for the effectual importation
of money & Bullion into this Province

An Act concerning the Transportation of publick Letters
Voted that the Lower House be moved to some more effectual way for the trans-
portation of publick Letters & in that of Ferrys

An Act for Port Duties & Masters of Ships. Voted that the Lieut.^l General
be desired to confirm it in his Lordship's name

An Act concerning the killing of wild Cattle. Voted that the Lower
House be consulted with for a more effectual way for the destroying of wild
Cattle.

Ordered that Mr Daniel Janifer Mespenger be sent from this House to
the Lower House to present that seditious paper published at Ann Arundel
with the Vote of this House for their Concurrence

Then came a member of the Lower house & presented this following Paper

Whereas at the last Grand Assembly held for this Province the
Burgesses then assembled did humbly desire that an Act might then pass
both Houses to this effect, that the members & Burgesses of this Assembly &
all other Assemblies ever hereafter have free liberty of Speech in delivering

or Estates to any bill or Order propounded or what shall be propounded by them
for the good & Liberty of the Inhabitants here.
