Then was the Act returned from the Lower House with their Assent Voted that it should be fair Engrossed

After which both houses meeting in the Upper House the Acts fair Engrossed were read over & signed by the Clerk of either house respectively and his Lordships Assent declared by the Lieutenant General in these words.
