

Lord Proprietor of this Province & subject to no Indian whatsoever

8. That John Roberts & Thomas Morris do pay the Indians of Chingawateick three hundred & twenty Arms length of Roanoke for the Indian that was slain by them at the head of Portoback Creek in August last -

9. That every Indian that killeth or stealeth an hog Calf or other Beast, or other Goods shall undergo the same punishment that an English man doth for the same offence

10. That the several Nations afo. shall continue upon the place where they now live & that the honourable the Governour be desired to lay out their several bounds as to him in justice shall seem most for the publick good between this & the last of June next ensuing within which bounds it shall not be lawful for the said Nations to entertain any foreign Indians whatsoever to live with them without leave from the Lord Proprietor or his Lieutenant Governour here for the time being & that the said Indians shall not be forced or removed from the said places so to be limited & appointed to them by the Governour as afo. unless the Nation or Nations or any particular persons of these nations hereafter to be removed shall signify their willingness to be removed by the Consent of their Matchcomicks to such Commr. as the Lord Proprietor or his chief Governour here for the time being by Commission under the Great Seal of this Province to be authorized to take the same & Licence thereupon from his said Lordship or his Governour here to remove had & obtained

11. That the afo. Nations shall from & after the first of December next ensuing fence in their Cornfields from hogs & Cattle of the English and if any English man wilfully throw down any of their Fences they shall make the Indians full satisfaction for their Damage

12. In case any Servant or Slave run away from their Masters & come to any of the Indian Towns afo. that the said Indians shall apprehend them & bring them to the next English Plantation to be conveyed to their Masters & if any Indians afo. or convey any such fugitive out of this Province that he shall make the respective Master or Masters of such Servant or Servants such satisfaction as an Englishman ought to do in the like case

13. That all great men here present do immediately sign these articles & that the great men of these Towns that were here & are returned or otherwise did not come but by their proxies shall come to the Governour when he comes to Piscataway to make the Imperour sign the peace here concluded, or else to be deemed & as good as well to the
