

against Doctor Filghman ordered that the said Filghman bring in such Witnesses as he has brought down & are ready to be examined by this House touching the Charge already exhibited ag^t him and that the Lower House have notice thereof and examine their Witnesses if any they have so as Publication may duly pass and this House proceed to a final Determination of the several Articles in the said Charge specified.

This House desired Major Fitzherbert to acquaint the Lower House therewith & thereupon the Lower House by Cap^t. Jenifer & Mr. Woolman desired a Copy of their Charge ag^t D^r. Filghman ordered that a Copy be made thereof & sent to the Lower House which being made Major Fitzherbert was desired to carry it to the Lower House.

John Darby a witness produced sworn & examined touching the Charge against Doctor Filghman upon his oath with that last February last there being some difference about the publick Levy Mr. Filghman desired the Dep^y to receive of those people that were willing to pay 4^s 6^d $\frac{1}{2}$ poll and of those that were not willing to pay 4^s 6^d $\frac{1}{2}$ poll to take 4^s . And this Dep^y with that those that were not willing he never forced to pay the said 4^s 6^d $\frac{1}{2}$ poll. This Dep^y was present in the County Court of the said County of Calvert in January afores^d when there was some Difference about the publick Levy that it was laid too high whereupon Mr. Filghman told the Court that if there was any mistake in his setting up the Levy too high that he would answer the Overplus to the Country in regard it was too late for them to alter and him to receive the Levy that year with which the whole Court seemed satisfied. The Dep^y going with Mr. Filghman to the house of John Ingram or where he had formerly lived to receive Debt and Levy & other Debt & on Executions the said Mr. Filghman demanded my Debt & Levy & a Woman then in the said House told the said Mr. Filghman in the hearing of this Dep^y that he the said John Ingram had no Deb^t there only some Indian Grain part whereof the said John Ingram had sold. Whereupon the Dep^y with the said Mr. Filghman did seize about 26 Barrels of Indian Corn for the said Debt Levy & Executions and afterwards this Dep^y sent
