No. 8. An act to establish orphans courts in the several counties of this state.

No. 9. An act to make the bills of credit issued by congress, and the bills of credit emitted by acts of assembly and resolves of the late conventions, a legal tender in all cases.

No. 10. An act for the erecting barracks.

No. 11. An act to revive the proceedings of Frederick county court.

No. 12. An act concerning marriages.

No. 13. An act for the more speedy and effectual recovery of common law fines and forseited recognizances.

No. 14. An act for quartering soldiers.

No. 15. An act to open the courts of justice, and for other purposes.

No. 16. An act to enable the governor to issue commissions of oyer and terminer and gaol delivery in certain cases.

No. 17. An act to continue the acts of assembly therein mentioned.

No. 18. An act concerning duties.

No. 19. An act for holding an election for sheriffs in Somerset county, and to enable the governor and council to determine the validity of elections for sheriffs.

No. 20. An act to punish certain crimes and misdemeanors, and to prevent the growth of toryism.

No. 21. An act to affess and impose an equal tax on all property within this state.

No. 22. An act relating to the all ssment of property in this state.

No. 23. An act for the payment of the jou nal of accounts.

No. 24. An act for enlarging the powers of the governor and council.

Senate adjourns to Monday the 18th of August next.
