Which engrossed bill was read and assented to, and the paper bill thereof so endorsed.

The paper bills from No. 33 to No. 42 were sent to the house of delegates by Matthew

ORDERED, That Upton Sheredine, Esq; wait upon the governor and request his attendance Tilghman, Esq;

in the senate to sign and seal the engrossed bills. The governor appeared in the senate. ORDERED, That Matthew Tilghman and Charles Carroll of Carrollton, Esquires, acquaint the house of delegates that the governor is ready to sign and seal the engrossed bills, and request The house of delegates appeared in the senate, and the following engrossed bills were presented by the speaker to the governor, who signed the same, and affixed the great seal thereto in the presence of the members of both houses.

No. 33. An act to prohibit the going at large swine and geese in Baltimore-town, in Balti-

more county.

No. 34. A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for enlarging the powers of the governor and council.

No. 35. An act for the assessment of property within this state.

No. 36. An act for recruiting the quota of troops of this state in the American army.

No. 37. An act for the relief of certain nonjurors. No. 38. An act for calling out of circulation certain bills of credit emitted by act of assembly.

No. 39. An act to encrease the allowances of witnesses and the sees of constables.

No. 40. An act to encrease the allowance of justices of the peace and jurymen.

No. 41. An act for the special appointment of inspectors, and to encrease their salaries and the warehouse rent.

No. 42. An act for the payment of the journal of accounts. The senate adjourns to the 29th day of March next.
