No. 26. An act directing and empowering the administrators of Frederick Foreman, late of Queen-Anne's county, to sell and dispose of part of a tract of land therein mentioned, and to apply the money arising therefrom.

No. 27. An act for the relief of Duncan Campbell and James Burney, languishing prisoners
