

No. 38. An act ascertaining what shall be recovered on protested bills of exchange, and to repeal an act of assembly therein mentioned.

No. 39. An act for consolidating the funds belonging to King William's school in the city of Annapolis with the funds of St. John's college.

No. 40. A bill, entitled, An act to enable John Eagar Howard of Baltimore county, to convey to the vestry of St. Paul's parish, and their successors, a parcel of ground adjoining Baltimore-town, for the purposes therein mentioned.

No. 41. An act for the valuation of personal property within this state.

No. 42. An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors confined in sundry gaols of this state.

No. 43. A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the destroying of wolves in Washington and Frederick counties.

No. 44. A Supplementary act to the act, entitled, An act for building a new church in the city of Annapolis.

No. 45. An act for the benefit of Anne Hood, Hester Hood, Elizabeth Hood, and Mary Hood, of Anne-Arundel county.

No. 46. An act directing what shall be good evidence to prove foreign and other debts, and deeds and wills, and instruments of writing executed in any of the United States, or in any foreign country, for allowing discounts, and for repealing an act of assembly therein mentioned.

No. 47. A Supplement to the act, entitled, An act directing the proceedings against persons guilty of fornication.

No. 48. An act to empower the justices of Baltimore county, to assess and levy a sum of money on said county to finish the building of the court-house in said county.

No. 49. An act to declare and ascertain the right of citizens of this state to private roads or ways.

No. 50. An act for altering the time of holding the courts in the counties therein mentioned.

No. 51. An act for the benefit of Elizabeth Fleming, Margaret Offutt, and Anne Harding.

No. 52. An act for the relief of the widows of such officers of this state who died in the continental service.

No. 53. An act to ascertain the value of the land in the several counties of this state for the purpose of laying the public assessment.

No. 54. A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act to establish a market in Frederick town in Frederick county, and for the regulation of said market.

No. 55. An act for erecting a town at the mouth of Susquehanna river, in Harford county, and for appointing commissioners to regulate and govern the same.

No. 56. An act for the benefit of the estate of Anne Catharine Green.

No. 57. An act for the relief of the poor in the counties of Dorchester and Somerset.

No. 58. An act to suspend the erecting of the public buildings in Harford county.

No. 59. An act to enable the justices of Prince-George's county court, to assess and levy a sum of money on the said county for the support of James Ranter, a lunatic.

No. 63. An act relative to the arrearages of taxes due the state before the first day of January seventeen hundred and eighty-three.

No. 64. An act to invest the United States in congress assembled with a power to levy, for the use of the United States, particular duties on certain enumerated articles, and five per cent. on all other foreign merchandise, imported into this state.
