THE House met.—Present the same members as on yesterday.—The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Donaldson delivers a petition from Thomas Bond and William Robertson of the city of Baltimore, praying that a sum of money decreed to be due to them by the state, may be paid; which was read and referred to Messrs. Donaldson, Pechin and Brown.

Mr. F. Hall delivers the following report:

THE Committee to whom was referred the petition of Alexius Boone, of Prince George's county, report, That they have taken the same into consideration, and are of opinion that the prayer of the petitioner ought to prevail; they therefore submit to the consideration of the legislature, the following resolution:

*Resolved*, That the proceedings against Alexius Boone, and his securities, on two judgments against them on account of a balance due to the said state by the said Alexius Boone, as sheriff of Prince George's county, be and they are hereby suspended until the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirteen; and also, that the said Alexius Boone and his securities, be and they are hereby released from the payment of the nine per cent per annum of the fifteen per cent interest chargeable upon the principle of the balance due the state, on condition only that the said Alexius Boone and his securities shall punctually pay to the treasurer of the Western Shore, on or before the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirteen the principal of the balance due the state, with interest on the same, at the rate of six per cent per annum, together with all costs on said judgments; provided, That the judgments aforesaid shall be in full force, and continue notwithstanding the suspension directed by this resolution, and that if the said Alexius Boone and his securities shall fail in said payment, they shall forfeit the benefit of this resolution, and shall be liable to be proceeded against immediately for the whole of the said debts and costs, and the fifteen per cent interest, now payable thereon.

Which was read.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill relating to the hospital in the vicinity of the city of Baltimore; the bill for the relief of Richard Mackall, junr; the bill to empower the levy court of Worcester county, to sell the ware-houses in said county; and the bill to appoint commissioners to grade, level, pave and repair the streets, squares, lanes and alleys in that part of the eastern precincts of Baltimore, therein described, and for other purposes, severally endorsed, "will pass;" ordered to be engrossed; the bill to incorporate a company for building a bridge over Chop-tank river, at or near Denton ferry, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read, agreed to and the bill ordered to be engrossed. And the supplement to
