The bill to authorise the levy court of Washington county to appoint commissioners to alter, straighten, open and amend a road therein mentioned, was read the second time and passed. The report in favor of Notley Maddox, of Prince George's county, was read the second time, and the resolution therein contained assented to.

Mr. R. Neale delivers the following report:

THE Committee to whom was referred the petition of Clement Sewell, late an ensign in the third Maryland regiment, report, That they have taken the same into consideration, and find the facts therein stated to be true; they therefore recommend the following resolution:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay to the said Clement Sewall annually during his life, or to his order, in quarterly payments, such sum of money as will be equal to the half pay of an ensign.
