

The bill to authorise the levy court of Washington county to appoint commissioners to alter, straighten, open and amend a road therein mentioned; the additional supplement to the act entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of Frederick county; the bill fixing the mode in which any quota of militia hereafter to be furnished by this state for the common defence shall be raised; and the resolutions in favor of the Examiner-General, Alexius Boone, Robert Elliott, Notley Maddox and Clement Sewell, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Pechin delivers a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Marcus Heyland, an insolvent debtor of the city of Baltimore; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Moffitt delivers a bill entitled, An act to authorise the chancellor to decree a sale of certain lands; and Mr. Belt delivers a bill entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned; which were severally read.

The clerk of the senate delivers the supplement to an act entitled, An act for the relief of Rufus Bigelow and John G. Proud of the city of Baltimore; and the bill to legitimate the acknowledged children of Peter Rouck and Jacob Kershner, of Washington county; severally endorsed, "will pass;" ordered to be engrossed. Also, the bill to authorise a lottery for the benefit of Salisbury in Somerset and Worcester counties; and the bill for the relief of the infant children of Francis S. Manning, late of Charles county, deceased; severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, agreed to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed. Also the resolution in favor of John J. Jacob, endorsed "dissented from;" and the following message:
