THE Committee to whom was referred the petition of Sedgwick James of Harford county, report, That they have had the same under consideration, and are of opinion that the prayer of the petitioner is reasonable and ought to be granted ; they therefore submit the following resolution :

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Sedgwick James of Harford county, or to his order, the sum of forty two dollars, the same having been paid by him into the treasury, as composition-money for part of a tract of land, called the "Hunting Ground," lying and being in Harford county, the said part lying foul of an elder tract, called "Hutchinson's Discovery." All which is submitted.

Mr. T. Williams delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Cecil county, praying for district schools, and for taxing bank stock for the support of the same ; which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the relief of Isaac Hendricks of the city of Baltimore ; the bill for the relief of Joseph Ennalls ; the bill to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Salisbury in Somerset and Worcester counties ; and the bill for the relief of Marcus Heyland ; severally endorsed, " will pass," ordered to be engrossed. Also a bill entitled, An act to regulate the mode of qualifying jurors for the trial of civil actions in the county courts of this state ; and a bill entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in the city of Baltimore ; severally endorsed, " will pass ;" which were severally read ; and the resolutions in favor of Thomas E. Bond, William Richardson and Sutton I. Weems, severally endorsed, " assented to."

Mr. Pechin delivers a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Andrew Barge, an insolvent debtor of the city of Baltimore ; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Marriott delivers a petition from Richard Proctor of Anne-Arundel county, a revolutionary soldier, praying relief ; which was read and referred to Messrs. Marriott, Belt and A. Dorsey.

The report in favor of Isaac Perryman, was read the second time, the resolution therein contained assented to and sent to the senate.

The house according to the order of the day proceeded to the second reading of the bill separating the business of the court of Chancery, and authorising the holding sessions of the said court for the Eastern Shore, and for other purposes.
