The senate then proceeded to the election of a president, and the ballots being deposited in the lot box, on examination thereof it appeared that the honorable Elijah Davis was unanimously ted. Whereupon, it is declared in the senate that the honorable Elijah Davis is unanimously ted president thereof.

Mr. Thomas Rogers was appointed clerk, Mr. James G. Davis, assistant clerk, and Mr. Henry liamson, committee clerk, who severally qualified as such.

The president laid before the senate a letter, dated September 18, 1813, from Mr. Thomas Hawis, resigning his seat in the senate. Which was read. Whereupon Resolved, that the senate
