The same members appeared as on yesterday. Peter Emerson, Esq. appeared in the senate; who adburn until to-morrow morning.

THURSDAY, December 9, 1819.

The same members appeared as on yesterday, who adjourn until to-morrow morning.

FRIDAY, Becember 10, 1819.

The same members appeared as on yesterday. William Spencer, William Hughlett, and Virgil Maxy, Esqrs. appeared in the senate.

A sufficient number of members to compose a senate being convened, they severally qualified in the resence of each other, before Robert Welch, (of Ben ) one of the justices of the peace for Anne-Aruael county, agreeably to the constitution and form of government.

The senate then proceeded to the election of a president; and the ballots being deposited in the ballot ox, on examination thereof it appeared, that the honourable William Spencer, Esq. was unanimously

lected.

Whereupon it is declared in the senate, that the honourable William Spencer, Esq. is unanimously lected president thereof. Mr. John N. Watkins was appointed clerk; Mr. Thomas J. Brice was appointed assistant clerk; and

Ir. Louis Gassaway committee clerk; who severally qualified as such.

Mr. Gottleb J. Grammar was appointed messenger, and Mr. Henry Coulter door keeper, who qualified

The following message was sent to the house of delegates:

BY THE SENATE, December 10, 1819.

fentlemen of the House of Delegates,

The senate having formed a house is ready to proceed with the business of the session. We have apointed the honourable William Spencer, President, and John N. Watkins chief clerk, and propose to it, for the dispatch of public business, from ten o'clock in the morning until three in the afternoon.

By order, J. N. WATKINS, Cik. On motion, Ordered, That Messrs. Winder and Hughlett be a committee to wait on his excellency the overnor, and inform him that this house is organized for business, and ready to receive any communica-

ion he may think proper to lay before them.

The clerk of the executive delivers a communication, with sundry documents; which were read and rdered to be printed.

The senate adjourns until to morrow morning 10 o'clock.

SATURDAY, December 11, 1819.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Maxcy. Richard W. West, Esq. appeared, qualified, and took his seat. The proceedings from Monday the sixth inclusive ere read.
