And delivered a resolution in favor of John Trucks which was read and referred to to Messrs, Johnson, Orrell, Miller and Dickinson.

Also a resolution in favor of Benjamin West, of the city of Baltimore, read and referred to Messrs. Johnson, Orrell, Miller

and Dickinson.

Also a resolution in favor of Daniel Auld, of Talhot county, and a resolution in favor of Samuel Davis, and a resolution in favor of Benjamin Marshall; which were read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Johnson, Orrell, Miller and Dickinson.

Also a bill entitled an act to continue in force the acts of assembly which would expire with the present session; which was read the first, and by special order, a second and third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Gentlemen of the Senate, and

of the House of Delegates,

I have the honor to transmit herewith, sundry communications from our senators and representatives in congress, acknowledging the receipt of resolutions passed by the general assembly, among which, one is received from general Samuel Smith, last evening, by which it will be seen that the President of the United States has recommended to the favorable consideration of congress, the claim of the state for interest upon the money advanced and expended for its defence during the late war, in the decided terms, that from its manifest justice, was to have been expected. We may now indulge the pleasing anticipation of a speedy adjustment and payment of this claim.
