

Wednesday, 31st January, 1827.

The senate met. Present the same member as on yesterday, except Mr. Nelson. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The amendments heretofore proposed to the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to alter and amend the charter of the city of Annapolis, were read a second time, and assented to.

Mr. Sewell delivered the following report, which was read. The committee to whom was referred, a bill from the house of delegates for the relief of Michael De Young of the city of Baltimore, having had the said bill, with the accompanying documents, under their consideration, beg leave to report, that in their opinion, said bill ought to pass.

The bill for the relief of Michael De Young, of the city of Baltimore, was read a second time.

Mr. Johnson delivered the following report, which was read.

The committee appointed on the part of the senate, to join the committee appointed on the part of the house of delegates, to count the ballots in the election held on yesterday, for directors on the part of the state, in the several banks, beg leave to report, that in counting the ballots, they had found, that for the Union Bank, Hugh M'Eldry had 67 votes, Alexander C. Bullit 33 votes, Charles C. Egerton 29 votes, John P. Kennedy 25 votes, John H. B. Morton 10 votes, and William Meeteer 8 votes. For the Commercial and Farmers Bank, Richard Estep had 43 votes, William Crawford, Jr. 38 votes, George Riston, 38 votes, Stephen H. Ford 19 votes, Robert D. Burns 18 votes, and John G. Proud had 15 votes. That for the Mechanics Bank, William Stewart had 60 votes, Henry B. Griffith 50 votes, Nathaniel Pearce 28 votes, Charles Salmon 23 votes, and Tobias E. Stansbury 16 votes. For the Farmers Bank of Maryland, Jeremiah T. Chase had 78 votes, and Theodorick Bland 76 votes. For the Branch Bank at Easton, Lambert W. Spencer had 79 votes, and William Clark 78 votes. For the Hagerstown bank, John Van Lear, Jr, had 80 votes, and David Schnebley 79 votes, and that for the Elkton Bank, Adam Whann had 80 votes.

Whereupon, it was declared in the senate, that Hugh M'Eldry and Alexander C. Bullit, for the Union Bank of Maryland. Richard Estep for the Commercial and Farmers Bank. William Stewart and Henry B. Griffith, for the Mechanics Bank. Theodorick Bland, and Jeremi-
