

"And be it enacted, That the said Henrietta S. Love, shall have and exercise, all the rights, privileges and immunities, and be subject to all the legal responsibilities of a feme sole, in the same manner she would have been if she had never been married."

"And be it enacted, That the said William S. Love, shall not be liable for any debt to be hereafter contracted by the said Henrietta S. Love."

Which amendments were read and assented to.—The bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Harrison offered the following message, which was read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

By the Senate, February 9th, 1827.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution, requiring the treasurer of the western shore, to withhold payment, under the act of December session, 1824, chapter 125, during the continuance of the present session of assembly, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Also, a resolution in favour of William Johnston of Harford county, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to authorise the Revd. Henry L. Davis, to remove certain negroes from the state of Delaware, to this state, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Dennis, Heath and Forrest.

Mr. Sewell from the committee on divorces, made a favourable report upon the bill for the relief of Mary Snowden, of Cecil county. The said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Heath asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act relating to habitual drunkards.—Ordered, that Messrs. Heath, Herbert, and Johnson, be a committee to prepare and report the same.
