

The bill to authorise and empower the justices of the levy court of Charles county, to fix and regulate the rates of public ians, was read the second time.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution, for commemorating the birth of the illustrious Washington, which was read the first time.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the town of Williamsport in Washington county, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Whitely and Forrest.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower the levy court of Frederick county, to levy a sum of money and erect an engine and hose house in Frederick-Town, which was read the first time.

The bill for the relief of Henrietta S. Love, of the city of Baltimore, was read a third time.—On motion, the question was put, “will the senate receive the following, as an additional amendment to the said bill, viz:”—At the end of the 2d, section of the bill as amended, add the following proviso. “Provided that nothing in this act contained shall affect the rights of third persons acquired previous to the passage of this act.”—Determined in the affirmative:—And the bill was then passed as amended.

The bill for the relief of Mary Snowden, of Cecil county, was read a third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Dennis, from the committee to whom was referred the bill to make valid certain deeds therein mentioned, made an unfavourable report upon the same.—The bill was then read a second and by special order a third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Sewell, from the committee on divorces, to whom was referred the bill for the relief of Priscilla North, of Somerset county, reported the same with the following amendments, viz:—Add the following proviso at the end of the bill.—“Provided nothing herein contained shall affect the rights of creditors acquired prior to the passage of this act,” which amendment was read and assented to.—The bill was then read a second time.

On motion, the question was put, “will the senate reconsider the bill for the relief of Henrietta S. Love of the city of Baltimore. Determined in the affirmative.

The said bill was then ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Sewell from the committee to whom was referred, the bill from the house of delegates, entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company for the purpose of building a bridge over the river Susquehanna, at Havre-de Grace, made an unfavourable report on the said bill.—The bill was then read a second time.
