

Mr. Marriott from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill to protect the breed of fish in Anne Arundel county, the said bill, was then read a second and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Dennis from the committee, reported a bill entitled, an act relating to the commissioners of the tax for Worchester county, which was read, the first and by special order a second time, and ordered to be engrossed; and having been engrossed was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

On motion, the bill entitled, an act to repeal the act of assembly therein mentioned, was ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution in favour of William Gilpin, of Jefferson county, state of Virginia, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also, a resolution authorising the treasurer of this state to settle the accounts of public officers upon their paying the principal of their respective debts and interest at the rate of six per. cent. per annum.—Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower commissioners to open and extend the breadth of an Alley in Westminster, in Frederick county, which was read the first time.

Mr. Sewell, delivered the following report, which was read, and with the bill to which it relates, ordered to lie on the table.

The committee to whom was recommitted the bill to divorce, Henrietta S. Love, from her husband William Love, of the city of Baltimore, having had the same under their further consideration,—do now recommend and report favourably upon the bill as it originated in the house of delegates without further amendment.—Except the following proviso.—“Provided that nothing in this act contained shall effect the rights of third persons acquired previous to the passage of this act.
