

first words, "a supplement to."—2nd, In the 4th line of the 1st section, strike out the word, "commissioners," and insert in lieu thereof, the word "collector."—3d, In the 5th line of the same section, strike out the words, "have or."—4th, In the 5th line of the same section, strike out the word "the," and insert in lieu thereof, the letter "a."—5th, After the word county, in the 6th line of the same section, insert the following before the word "in," in the 7th line of the same section, "in addition to those newspapers heretofore prescribed by law."—6th, In the 7th line of the same section, strike out the word, "are," and insert in lieu thereof, "they were prior to the passage of this act."—7th, In the 2d line, 1st section, add the letter "s," after the word, "resident."

Which amendments were read, and assented to.—The bill was then read a second and third time by special order, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Whiteley from the committee, to whom was referred the bill relative to the duties of the trustees of the poor for the several counties therein mentioned reported the same with the following amendments, viz.—1st. At the end of the first section, add, "if approved of by said court."—2nd. In the first line 5th section strike out "November and insert August," which amendments were read, and assented to.

On motion, the following were offered as additional amendments to the said bill, and assented, to.—1st. Strike out the word "Talbot" in the 2d, line of the 1st, section; strike out the word Worcester, in the 3d line same section.

The bill thus, amended was ordered to lie on the table.

The resolution relative to the records, of Talbot county court was read the second, and by special order a third time, dissented from and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Heath, from the committee reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for enlarging the power of the high court of chancery. A bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to declare and enlarge the powers of the court of chancery, and the county courts as courts of equity, and a bill entitled, an act to regulate the bounds of prisons in this state, which were severally read the first time, and ordered to be printed.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered, a bill entitled, an act for draining a branch and the low lands at Parson's Creek and Tobacco Stick, in Dorchester county, which was read the first time.

Also, a bill entitled, an act for draining certain lands in Caroline county, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Whiteley, Rees and Dennis.

And returned the bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act for enlarging the powers of the High court of chancery, and the bill for the benefit of Alfred H. Dashiell.
