

sion of Worcester county, into election districts, which was read the first time.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to authorise Rachel Colvin and Samuel Colvin of the city of Baltimore, to execute deeds for certain property therein described, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Heath, Johnson and Sewell.

And returned the bill relating to the commissioners of the tax of Worcester county, and the bill entitled, an act relating to injunctions severally endorsed, will pass.

The senate proceeded to the consideration of the bill regulating writs of error, and granting appeals to the court of appeals.—On motion the question put, “will the senate receive the following as amendments.” viz.—In the 17th line of the 1st section, strike out the word “next.”—In the 18th line of the same section after the word ‘be,’ insert the words ‘within the time required by law.’ At the end of the 6th section, add the following, viz: “within forty days next after the appeal therein, shall have been entered on the writ of error produced and filed; and upon receipt of such transcript by the clerk of the court of appeals, he shall enter the case on the docket of his court, as of the term next after the date of the appeal or of the writ of error in such case.”—In the 4th line of the 8th section, strike out the words ‘at the term next succeeding the time of’ and insert ‘within the time prescribed by law.’ Determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Forrest, offered the following as an amendment, viz.—Between the 16th and 17th sections, insert the following, viz. ‘And be it enacted, That if hereafter any execution, shall be issued upon any judgment, within sixty days after the vendition of said judgment, under which the defendant has been or shall be arrested or his property seized, and he shall appeal therefrom and file a bond agreeably to the provisions of this act, such bond shall operate to stay all further proceedings under the said judgment, as if the appeal had been entered and the bond filed before any execution issued; and the party arrested and the property seized be released to the defendant, upon his paying the poundage fee to which the sheriff would have been entitled, if the appeal bond had not been taken.’

The same having been read, the question was put, ‘will the senate assent to the same.’
