

the more effectual paving the streets of Baltimore town, in Baltimore county.—The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Heath, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill to regulate the manner of giving public notice in cases required by law.

On motion, the committee to whom was referred, the bill to provide for the valuation and condemnation of a lot of land at the mouth of Cambridge creek, in Dorchester county, for the erecting and establishment of a tide mill, was enlarged by the addition to it, of Messrs. Sewell and Marriott.

Mr. Marriott, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill to make a public road therein mentioned. The bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Nelson, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the resolution for the suspension of further proceedings for the recovery of the public claim on the Potomac company.—The resolution was then read a second, and by special order a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Kennedy, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill to incorporate a company in Funck's town, in Washington county, to be called the Funck's town fire company.—The bill was then read a second, and third time by special order, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to change the manner of summoning jurors to attend the county courts in Worcester county, to repeal certain acts of assembly therein mentioned, and for other purposes, was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill supplementary to the act entitled, an act authorising commissioners to lay out a road in Montgomery and Anne Arundel counties, passed at December session, 1823, chapter 42, was read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.
